 - Tactical Pistol Class
 - Tactical Trauma Class (optional)
- When:
 - Register with deposit by Saturday Sept. 19th.
 - Sunday October 4th
 - Saturday October 3rd
 - We need 12 students to fill up a class for each day
- Where:
 - Colorado Shooting Sports in Greeley
- Who:
 - Anyone from first-timers to experts will benefit from this course.
- Why:
 - Improve your safety, knowledge, and capabilities with firearms.
 - Fulfill the training requirement for a Concealed Carry Permit.

Class Overview – Tactical Pistol

- 4 Hours Classroom
 - Safety: Always First!
 - Legal: What you need to know as a gun owner in Colorado.
 - Technical: Basic function of various firearms. What to do in the case of malfunctions. Statistics that help you survive.
 - Mindset: Give yourself the mental edge to decisively win any fight. Survival is not enough!
- 4 Hours Range
 - Learn the proper mechanics involved in fighting with a pistol.
 - Loading, Unloading, Reloading (Tactical and Emergency)
 - Holstering, Re-holstering, Draw, Grip
 - Sight Alignment, Sight Picture, Trigger Control, and Target Engagement
 - Apply the basic fundamentals to real-world scenarios.
 - Shooting with one hand (strong and weak)
 - Shooting on the move
 - Shooting from various positions (fetal position, supine, prone, etc.)
- Much more will be covered than can be listed. In short, this class works to instill in you the tools you need to properly react to, and outright win, situations you hope to never be in.

Class Overview – Tactical Pistol

■ Cost

- Colorado Shooting Sports is doing special group pricing for the 912 Project.
- Class Fee: \$150 (reg. \$200)
- Ammo: \$80-\$100 (required to buy 200 rounds. Price depends on caliber)
- Equipment: \$20 (reg. \$40) Includes gun, holster, mags, mag holder, eye and ear protection
- Example 1: (Have your own equipment, shooting 9mm)
 - \$150 (class fee) + \$80 (ammo) = **\$230 total**
- Example 2: (Rent equipment, shooting 40 S&W)
 - \$150 (class fee) + \$100 (ammo) + \$20 (rent) = **\$270 total**
- FYI: Some “Concealed Carry” classes charge up to \$300 and don’t even require you to fire a weapon!

■ More Information

- 912 Project Students will also receive a **discount of \$50** off any new gun from Colorado Shooting Sports. (Normally \$25) A box of ammo (~\$25 value) and a 30 minute training course is also included on the firearm (cleaning, dis/reassembly, lubrication, maint. etc). Must purchase or start layaway within 30 days of taking the class.
- Fighting Pistol class is a prerequisite for other training through Colorado Shooting Sports. Other training includes:
 - Free Classes (\$25 range fee + supplies): Tactical Trauma, Low Light/Night Fighting, Vehicle Fighting, ...
 - Other Classes: Advanced Pistol, Tactical Rifle, Tactical Shotgun, ...

 - Tactical pistol is a prerequisite for this class.
 - Anthony Navarro B.S.N.R.N (the instructor) is also a registered nurse from UNC. This class is one of his specialties due to his medical background.
 - Treatment of burns, broken bones, lacerations, head injuries, and other lethal injuries will be covered. These include gunshot inflicted wounds, but apply to wounds you may encounter in car accidents or on playgrounds (God forbid).
 - You'll learn to use almost everything in the trauma kit. Perform ventilations, proper use of a tourniquet, and more stuff I have yet to learn about.
 - Medical skills will then be applied to firefights. How to properly evacuate a wounded person, etc. This is why you must also purchase ammunition for this class.
- Cost
 - Range Fee: \$25
 - Ammo: \$20-\$25 (required to buy 50 rounds. Price depends on caliber)
 - Trauma Kit: \$55 (This is a true tactical trauma kit, not a "first aid" kit)
 - Total: **\$100 - \$105** depending on caliber
 - Free CSS T-Shirt for anyone signing up for both the Pistol and Trauma class.
- More Information
 - You are more likely to use this training than the pistol training (car accidents, injuries around the home, etc.)
 - You (usually) don't get sued for medically saving a life.
 - Also ask about getting extra trauma kits (one for each vehicle, the home, and a practice kit)

- I (Clark Paterson) have personally taken this class (tactical pistol) along with my wife and several of my friends and family. Everyone I know who has taken this class was extremely impressed with the training and the improvement in their abilities from it. I've since taken any other training from Anthony that I can work into my schedule and budget.
- Don't be afraid to jump in. The course sounds intimidating, but it is designed to truly take you to a new level of competence (no matter where you start). I saw women who were afraid to pick up their pistols at the start of the day advance so at the end of the day they were hitting their targets, doing reloads, and clearing malfunctions all while on the move.
- Time and Cost:
 - The proper training may one day save your life or the life of a loved one (or even a stranger). You owe it to yourself to try to find the best training available if you are going to invest in training. Training is an investment in yourself.
 - Training with and being very proficient with one gun is more useful than having an arsenal of weapons you don't use regularly.
 - This class is very competitively priced compared to some other classes.
- Even if you have taken other classes, it is always helpful to be exposed to new techniques and methods. The more viewpoints you can absorb, the better your base for making your decision.
- We'll be training with a group of like-minded people. This will us to have a network of classmates to train with later and we will all be able to help each other remember the drills and techniques.
- You never know how long the government will allow citizens to have access to military quality training.
- Gun ownership allows you to truly be a full citizen. (Citizens are armed, subjects are unarmed) Citizens have a responsibility to exercise this right in the same way they have a responsibility to vote and participate in the political process.
